
Please follow the guidelines below to help protect our lake:

1. **Before ANY kind of boat** (and/or trailer) that has just returned from **ANY** other body of water, **please Clean, Drain and Dry every part of them thoroughly**.



- 2. Wash all parts of you watercraft where plants or animals can catch a ride! Thoroughly inspect the boat, motor, trailer and attached equipment for mud, plants and animals. Clean off anchors and anchor lines, water intake grates on jet-powered craft, kayak and canoe cockpits, storage compartments, and paddles, too! Dispose of all material away from the waterbody where it won't wash back into the water. Consider using the self-service wash at Conserve Car Wash, 1455 White Mountain Hwy, so that you can use their high pressure spray wand.
- 3. **Drain ALL water** from the boat including the motor, bilge, live wells, ballast tanks, storage compartments, and gear. Blow out water in jet-powered craft and tip paddle craft and motors to let out water. Drain all equipment away from the water where runoff won't flow back into the water. OPEN/REMOVE drain plugs and keep out/open while trailering. You may need a wrench to remove plugs.
- 4. Dry your boat completely.
- 5. Please do not use of any kind of jet propelled craft that has gone to another lake and has not been inspected. They are particularly worrisome as weed fragments can be lodged in the internal impellers where they are not visible and released into our lake.
- 6. The Lake Hosts at the town beach in Center Conway can help inspect your watercraft. They know how to examine both boats and trailers for invasive aquatic plant and animal material before they become a problem in the lake.
